My grandfather for example was an arable farmer and my dad Gerard started in 1962 with apples and pears. In 2005 I took over the business and a few years later I switched to organic production. Nicole and I have two children (Meeke and Staf) and they love it here on the farm !

Despite the fact that we only recently became organic, to my surprise we are already seeing significant differences. It seems that the trees have become stronger and less susceptible to certain diseases. My interpretation is that the trees are no longer relying on chemicals when it comes to combating illnesses and have to find the strength themselves, they are no longer “lazy”. Furthermore, we have noticed that the fruit is much tastier.
